Friends Crisis Meeting

Thank you to all the parents and teachers who attended the crisis meeting hosted by Mrs Pearce last Thursday. Positives from the meeting were that two parents - Ginche Parker and Eduardo Andrade - volunteered to arrange the infant party and also a fun day in September (more details below). We are extremely grateful to them both.

We also received some expressions of interest in joining the Friends committee next year. Information on roles and time commitments are set below for anyone else who thinks they may be interested. Typically roles are shared and do not require you to be at school every day or to attend every committee meeting. The Friends is a registered charity so new committee members will become Trustees and, as required by our Constitution, will need to be DBS checked.

CHAIR

- Hosts Friends' meetings and ensures the agenda is followed.
- Welcomes new members; coordinates the annual plan of events; enlists support from parent volunteers; liaises with the school / Governors; and develops the Friends as an organisation.
- Writes the annual report, liaising with the Secretary.

Time commitment: 2-3 hours per month.

This role is for you if.......you are a good motivator and manager, a confident public speaker and open to new ideas, can make decisions on what needs to be done and resist the temptation to 'meddle' while others get on and do the work!

SECRETARY

- Manages the Friends' diary, prepares agendas and takes and distributes the minutes of each meeting.
- Liaises with other Committee members to ensure clear communication and with the school office to deal with correspondence.
- Writes the annual report with the Chair.

Time commitment: 2-3 hours a month depending on meeting frequency.

This role is for you if.......you have office skills or are looking to move back into the workplace and want to develop them and don't mind parents and teachers 'marking' your minutes!

TREASURER

- Manages the FOSM bank account; provides cash floats for events, counts and banks monies; and pays agreed expenses.
- Maintains financial records and provides a finance update for each Committee meeting.
- Prepares annual accounts and liaises with the independent examiner and Charities Commission.

Time commitment: very flexible and less than 30 minutes a week.

This role is for you if......you like counting, can use excel and won't get embarrassed banking the Christmas Fayre profits - the queue behind you usually ends up going out of the door!

PUBLICATIONS

- Ensures events are publicised among the school community and, where appropriate, externally including the local press.
- Assists each event manager with the production of tickets / posters.
- Oversees the maintenance of the Friends' website and Facebook page.

Time commitment: 2 hours a month, depending on events.

This role is for you if......you know or would like to learn about marketing, would enjoy speaking to and promoting the school to local businesses; don't mind putting up the occasional poster around town in the rain!

Next time we will look at back at some of the highlights of this year.


